## YOUNG MEN AT THE HELM

Hudson River Sloop *Clearwater* invites you to be a part of a unique experience this summer onboard the tall ship, *Clearwater*. A replica of a 19<sup>th</sup> century Hudson River sailboat, *Clearwater* acts as a floating environmental classroom and seeks to inspire lifelong love for the natural world. Young Men at the Helm specifically seeks to engage young men from urban areas and the Hudson Valley in discovering and developing new talents and abilities in an amazing, unconventional, unforgettable experience.



**When and Where?** Young Men at the Helm takes place over three days in August from various docks along the Hudson River. Dates and locations vary, check our website for current information.

**What are we doing?** We'll be involved in a wide range of activities as individuals and in small groups. Activities include sail raising, fishing with a trawl net, testing and examining water quality, steering and navigating the sloop, learning sailors' arts, games, and relaxing on the river. Several guest speakers will be talking about community leadership, "green" careers, and the limitless opportunities open to young men today.

Who? This program is open to 15-18 year old young men from urban areas and the Hudson Valley.

**What do I bring?** Participants will need clothes, sun block, a rain jacket, a flashlight, and a sleeping bag if you have one. All meals are provided once you reach the boat.

**Is the boat safe?** Yes. The *Clearwater* is Coast Guard approved, and a very stable platform for studying the Hudson River. **This is an educational program, not a hard-core sailing challenge**. All activities will be supervised by a crewmember. Life jackets are available. We will only be on the river, so sea-sickness is usually not a problem. We never sail in dangerous weather, such as thunderstorms. If students or parents have any questions, please call our office and speak with an educator at (845) 265 8080 ext. 7115.

**Will we spend the night on the boat?** No. We'll be on the boat from about 9:30 a.m. until 4 p.m. or so each day. The nights will be spent on land at campsites (tents and/or cabins). Clearwater staff will spend the night with participants at the campsites, supervising and coordinating activities. On the third evening participants will return home before dinner.

**How much does it cost?** There is no cost to participants. All expenses are covered through a variety of scholarship donations and grants.

Do I have to be a sailor or a scientist to go? No! We'll teach you all you need to know.

**Who is in charge of this program?** The Clearwater organization plans and carries out the program. Specifically, Clearwater's Educator will be aboard for the entire program along with other experienced Clearwater staff and crew. 
