#### **NEXT MEETING, AUGUST 1st**

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

FROM ALBANY

Go SW on either Rt. 85 or 443. Out in the boonies, they will meet at the bottom of the aptly named letter S hill at a Stewart's store, then continue up the hill together. At the top of the hill they split again, and you will follow Rt. 85 toward Rensselaerville (LEFT turn) for 1.8 miles. The house is on the right up a longish driveway, with a mailbox that says Kelsey 3276 at the bottom.

#### FROM THE NORTHWAY

Take the Northway to the end, staying in the second lane from the right. Turn right, then get immediately to the left turn lane to turn onto Johnston Rd. Go to the end, then turn left again. Go to the end of that, and turn left again onto Rt 155. Follow that into Voorheesville and take the first turn off the traffic circle onto Rt. 85A. Go to the end, then turn right onto Rt. 85 and follow the above directions.

It sounds complicated, but we're only about 1/2 hour from Albany. —vk

### NRFC SPONSORED SAIL FOR THE RIVERVIEW BAPTIST CHURCH SUMMER CAMP

On July 14<sup>th</sup> nearly 30 campers, teen counselors and adults from the Riverview Baptist Church Summer Camp attended an educational sail aboard Clearwater that was entirely sponsored by NRFC. Stephen provided musical entertainment during the trip. The sail took place on a perfect day of sunshine and a light breeze that filled the sail and helped keep us cool. As we are all familiar with what happens on an educational sail, I won't describe the trip further but want to mention some of the preparation that went into this event.

After a nice meeting with Nancy Papish in Schenectady, I was armed with the information necessary to make the sail happen. On May 30<sup>th</sup> I met with Rev. Roxanne Booth of Riverview Baptist Church and went over all of the things Nancy mentioned, including the \$5 per adult fee, the need for proper clothing and most importantly, for this to be an ongoing educational experience. camp program is ideal for this purpose. Along with fun and entertainment, the camp provides many educational experiences, including trips to libraries, museums and to Barbara Heinzen's property which is an environmental preserve and natural classroom located on the Hudson between the Hannacroix and Coeymans creeks. Clearwater" and several videos that the kids got to review before boarding. I also provided a copy of Nancy's **Clearwater** video that was shown during the last Linda performance.

On the day before the sail I visited the Church and provided a short talk on the history of Clearwater and Pete Seeger. I described Clearwater and told them that the boat was 108 feet long. When I asked if the kids knew how big that was, they kind of shrugged so I said, well let's go find out. I had brought a 150-foot measuring tape and while one kid held the end we marched off the distance with, the other kids held the tape and called out the numbers as we went. They were shocked when we got to 108 feet and the person holding the end looked so far away. (Actually, I was surprised too. Clearwater doesn't seem so big when you are on her.) Afterward I taught the kids to shout Garbage!, Garbage!, Garbage! At the right time in the song and finally, they were reminded how to dress and what to bring.

On board, education continued thanks to the wonderful staff of Clearwater and its volunteers. Along with Captain Nick Rodgers, and Education Coordinator Krista Norris, each deserves mention here for the wonderful job they did. Special Maude-Julia thanks t o Blanchet (volunteer), Siobhan Sargent (volunteer), Aidan Reilly (volunteer) and Sarah Armour (engineer), and Amanda (sail trainee).

NRFC can be very proud of the work that it does to raise funds for deserving groups to take advantage of what Clearwater has to offer. I have often heard from adults how one trip aboard Clearwater in childhood stays with you for life. I cannot think of a greater gift that we can pass on to the next generation.

# CLEARWATER APPOINTS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR GREG WILLIAMS TO TAKE THE HELM

BEACON, NY – Hudson River Sloop Clearwater's Board of Directors has named Greg Williams as the organization's new Executive Director to lead the organization; Betsy Garthwaite, Board President, made the announcement today.

As Clearwater's Executive Director, Williams will be responsible for supervising all programs and operations, including developing and overseeing its strategic plans and fundraising goals. He will also work to further cultivate relationships with Hudson Valley partners and broaden both the base of support and the impact of Clearwater's activities.

Williams has recently returned home to the Hudson Valley after thirty years of experience in building teams and improving communication among boards of directors, customers, vendors and investors. Williams' formal education is in government, with a B.A. from Dartmouth College, and business administration, with an M.S. from the University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign.

Returning to the Hudson Valley for Williams is a return to his roots, having grown up in Croton, NY attending Clearwater's Great Hudson River Revival held annually at Croton Point Park.

"I was reminded of the urgency of public service by Pete Seeger himself in 2008: After performing on the David Letterman Show, he told the audience that he wasn't getting any younger, and that some of us would have to step forward to drive his causes beyond his life" said Williams. "Leading Clearwater represents an opportunity to answer Seeger's call. I am thrilled by the opportunity to return to the Hudson River Valley, where I grew up, and to carry on the work started by Pete and Toshi Seeger, whose message and influence is just as relevant to-day."

Williams will replace Acting Executive Director, Amy Larson Bonder who has kept the organization on course since September 2017. Bonder is also Clearwater's Director of HR and Admin. As Acting Continued on page 5

Executive Director, Bonder oversaw the day to day operations of the organization, the sloop's winter restoration, and successfully worked to ensure another successful Great Hudson River Revival music festival. Clearwater thanks Bonder for her many years of environmental leadership, 22 years of service to the organization, and commitment to the health of the Hudson River Valley.

Betsy Garthwaite, Clearwater's Board Chair commented, "I am very excited to welcome aboard a leader with Greg's capabilities as Executive Director. I look forward to working with him to strengthen this great organization and further its mission."
