It's hoped that better known performers will increase attendance enough to offset what they'll be paid. Stephen says he should have some names and a firm date by the February meeting.

**UPDATE:** Stephen reports that WAMC has agreed to rent The Linda to us on APRIL 7 for the fundraiser.

MAY: The Meeting date is the 1<sup>st</sup>.

GARAGE SALE Because of conflicts with the usual June date, the Spring sale is tentatively scheduled for May 19.

JUNE: The meeting date is the 5<sup>th</sup>.

UPDATE: Since the NRFC Annual Meeting, Clearwater has made the decision to hold Revival again this year on the weekend of June 15-16 at Croton Park. See page 3 for more information.

The Clearwater Revival will be the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> if it happens. Stephen met with George Lattimer to try to reduce our cost for the use of Croton. We'll also probably take out cancellation insurance in place of rain insurance, since it's cheaper.

Stephen points out that advance sale tickets are popular because of the lower price, and also are a big source of the funds that can be depended on to put the festival on.

The possibility of an alternative to Revival is being discussed, in the form of a 2-3 day show in Beacon.

JULY: The meeting date is the 3<sup>rd</sup>, noting that Independence Day occurs the next day.

The Camp and Paddle will be the 9-11<sup>th</sup>, moving to the following weekend if that doesn't work out.

NOTE THAT CLEARWATER WILL PROBABLY BE IN OUR AREA AUGUST TO SEPTEMBER.

SEPTEMBER: The meeting will be on the 4<sup>th</sup>, the day after Labor Day.

The 90 miler canoe etc. race will be the 5<sup>th</sup> through the 8<sup>th</sup>.

Tussings will be the weekend of the 8<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>. Mike has offered to talk to them about a price break.


DECEMBER: The meeting will be on the 4<sup>th</sup>.

BEACON, NY – The Great Hudson River Revival (Clearwater Festival) will return to Croton Point Park on June 15-16 on its traditional father's day weekend. Revival is the country's oldest and largest music and environmental festival, bringing together major musical acts and Clearwater's own brand of green activism for a unique weekend every June. Clearwater Festival 2019 takes place on the banks of the Hudson River at beautiful Croton Point Park, Croton-On-Hudson, NY. Tickets will be go on sale in February 2019.

Who: Clearwater Board of Directors approves proposal confirming that the Clearwater Festival will take place in 2019

## NRFC ANNUAL MEETING 2019 AKA WIMPS IN THE WILDERNESS

Besides our official agenda, we cooked and dinedrather extravagantly—and, of course, puzzled, finishing the one started at Veterans Weekend and making a good dent in another.

Clearwater Board President Stephen made some sweet evening music as well as being a superb chief breakfast chef, and the Paps made quite the la-de-da pinkies-up cake. Others of us enjoyed totally fabulous baked goodies by Vicki, Teo, Dan, and Kitty (Dutch sweets, too), roasted and sautéed and baked vegetable dishes by Kitty and Jas. Let's not forget savories including pickles, guacamole, smoked salmon and homemade lasagna, baked Alfredo-y chicken, salad, and Marsala-garlic roast turkey...the list goes on. Maybe we should call ourselves "North River Friends of Food"? outdoor pursuits didn't make up for all that energy intake save for shivering to stay warm. Snowshoeing the Peninsula Land Conservancy trails helped, as did a dogsled ride (though mainly by the
