Hope and Activism Endure as Clearwater Closes Out the 2020 Sailing Season

KINGSTON, NY - As the country continues to count the votes, the iconic Hudson River Sloop *Clearwater* will take one final sail this morning to close out the 2020 sailing season. Launching from the Hudson River Maritime Museum in Kingston, NY at approximately 10:30 AM, the sloop will motor out of the Rondout Creek and sail with its crew and staff until 1PM, after which the sloop will begin downrig and be prepared for the winter maintenance season. We invite our friends and neighbors to join this glorious spectacle and symbol of justice, activism and enduring hope.

As Clearwater founder Pete Seeger said, “The key to the future of the world, is finding the optimistic stories and letting them be known.” Launched 51 years ago, Clearwater continues Pete Seeger’s legacy as a leader of the environmental movement in the Hudson Valley.
