What I'm Talking About

People swim but they should and could swim more

The water quality is much better but not consistently "swimmable"

Watershed & infrastructure investments work but weak standards & climate change present risks to progress

Who Swam in the Hudson?

"In the 19th and early 20th Centuries, millions of people swam in the Hudson River every summer, from public beaches along the river's length or in floating pools located along Manhattan's shoreline."



Who Swims in the Hudson?

- 4 beaches (3 public), 1 pool
- 38+ other sites where recreation takes place
- 20 active open water swim events on 57 different days
- 5,000+ event swimmers, on average (pre-pandemic)





Who Would Swim in the Hudson?

- One in four residents swims or visits a beach & one in five kayaks, boats, paddleboards, jet-skiis, etc.
- +Pool, Ossining, Little Stony
 Point could expand access
- 15 other sites ID'd as potential new beaches

Who Can Swim in the Hudson?

- Many EJ communities do not have access to safe swimming
- Public beaches and other access points are at risk from sea-level rise





RIVERKEEPER Water Quality Standards

Classification

What is the "best use" of the waterway?

Protection & Restoration

If water doesn't meet criteria it doesn't support the use and needs to be improved **Water Quality Criteria**

How clean does the water need to be to support that use?

Assessment

Test the water.

Does it meet criteria?

Water Quality Criteria


Outdated freshwater standards for north of Bear Mtn Bridge

Designated uses

Swimming is not a designated use in the Capital District or NYC

Assessment

Effectively no data collection





South of Bear Mtn Bridge & NYC Water Quality Standards



Criteria - How clean is clean enough for swimming, kayaking and fishing? You have a voice!

Designated uses

Is the Hudson Safe for Swimming?


Most of the river, most of the time...

and especially not after rain










Climate Extremes and Water Quality

Extreme storms have at times made the entire river unsafe for swimming

Some Hudson River beaches have been closed multiple times in recent years





Toward a *more* swimmable Hudson

160+ sewer treatment plants many old or at risk

1000s of miles of sewer pipe, ~half 65+ years old

~250 CSOs in 29 Hudson River Watershed cities
